# VERSION 2016 OF THE KAARC MARCH WINDS TOUR

There were a few 'new' wrinkles to this year's tour, the first being that it was scheduled for April 9 rather than in March. That was a planned change. The second wrinkle was a bit on the unexpected side, as the weather person dished up a spring snow storm of some magnitude. This meant that instead of clear roads heading to the starting line, drivers encountered snow covered and icy ones. In spite of this surprise all hands were on deck at the Cardinal Bus in time for take-off around 7 am.

The tour, planned by members Don Gladstone and Fred Bierlein, entailed driving east on I-94 to Detroit where several points of interest would be visited. Stopping at the Traverse City Pie Company establishment near Ann Arbor, most riders chose to bulk up so as to ward off both the chill of the morning as well as the tasks before them. Under sail once again the bus didn't slow down until arriving in downtown Detroit near both the Detroit Historical Museum and the Detroit Institute of Art. Members could choose to visit either facility or try to cram in a tour of both. Most chose to head for the DHM first.

The DHM features a number of 'Signature' Exhibits as well as other Detroit related displays. Included are The America's Motor City layout; Detroit: The Arsenal of Democracy exhibit; Doorway to Freedom- Detroit and the Underground Railroad; Frontiers to Factories: Detroiters at Work 1701-1901; Streets of Old Detroit (a glimpse of Detroit in the 1890's) and Meier's Wonderful Clock (a huge many faceted time piece). It was possible to interact via multimedia devices with many of these exhibits.

Of special interest to motorheads was the moving assembly exhibit which showed the dropping down of the body of an '80's Cadillac onto an awaiting chassis. At various intervals one would encounter an automobile such as the 1896 King, the first documented motorcar to travel on the streets of Detroit, a dark gray 1936 Stout Scarab in need to some docent attention and paint as well as a Ford flatbed in which visitors could sit to have a photo op

Due to time constraints many other points of interest must be left for another time as it was necessary to cross Woodward Avenue to partake of the lunch option at the DIA. Several choices greeted the members and all managed to consume sustenance so as to climb aboard the bus for the next stop: the Ford Piquette Avenue plant.

This edifice appears on the outside to have been restored but once inside such is not currently the case. The building is much as it was when Henry and his workers plied their trade in constructing the early Fords, starting back in 1904. Only the 2nd and 3rd floors are currently used by the museum, the first floor being occupied by a paying tenant. After some introductory remarks by the staff and a brief history of the building, the group was divided into two groups to see and hear the building's story.

The museum docents provided a detailed commentary of the various tasks in constructing the first Fords using non assembly line methods. All pre 'T' models save the Model B were on hand to be seen and learned about. Then the history of the development of the Model T was shared as were some of the variants complete with examples of many. Included in this list were a depot hack, snow mobile, dump truck and more. Of special note was the 3rd floor 'special room' where Henry and some of his workers developed the Model T.

Another special exhibit was the Model T flatbed truck with a 'special' plate attached. Sitting just behind this truck was the very first Fruehauf trailer. The invention of this combo ushered in the tractor/trailer industry to American highways.

While there were quite a few Fords on hand, the museum also includes some of the other period marks including a Brush, 2 Maxwells, an Overland, a Studebaker, a Cadillac, an EMF and a Regal Underslung. As a quick trip to modern times we were treated to an early Mustang and silver Ford GT.

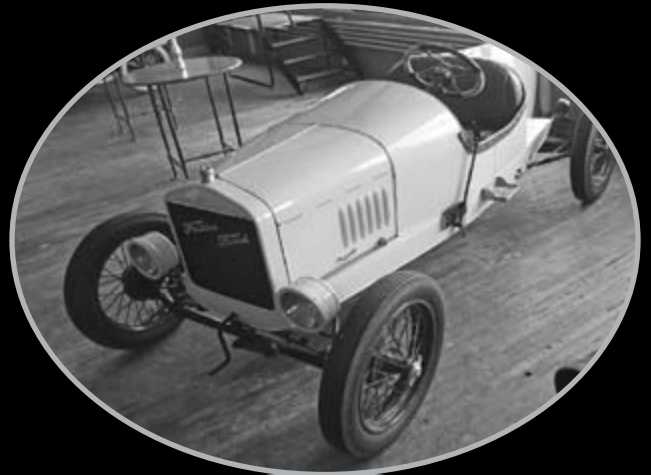
This important piece of automotive history has been saved from destruction and, given the enthusiasm of the volunteer staff plus growing patron attendance, it will continue to improve the experience of relating Ford Motor Company's early development.

Once this tour was completed, the bus moved back onto Woodward Avenue for the final Motor City stop, an ice cream emporium in Ferndale. Overheard more than once at this stop was the following: "How's that again? You don't have vanilla, chocolate or strawberry ice cream?" Once everyone had sampled the unique fare there the bus moved westward toward home, arriving safe and sound around 6:30. Travel on I-94 back west was not hindered in the least by the snow as, for the most part, it had melted away.

Once back in the Target parking lot, a round of applause was given to Fred and Don for a job well done. And so chalk up another successful "March" Winds Tour for KAARC members!
